 the Committee agreed with the
 Government that the proposed EU-US
 Transatlantic Trade and Investment
 Partnership (TTIP) could have significant
 positive strategic impact for the UK and
 the transatlantic relationship.

 take to respond to the opioid epidemic,
 with a particular focus on informing FDA's
 development of a formal method for
 incorporating individual and societal
 considerations into its risk-benefit
 framework for opioid approval and
 monitoring.
